

Matt 6:5 And when you pray, you shall not be like the hypocrites, because they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners, so that they may be seen by men. Truly I say to you, They have their reward in full. 6 But you, when you pray, enter into your private room, and shut your door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

7 And in praying do not babble empty words as the Gentiles do; for they suppose that in their multiplicity of words they will be heard. 8 Therefore do not be like them, for your Father knows the things that you have need of before you ask Him.

9 You then pray in this way: Our Father who is in the heavens, Your name be sanctified; 10 Your kingdom come; Your will be done, as in heaven, so also on earth. 11 Give us today our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. 13 And do not bring us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen. 14 For if you forgive men their offenses, your heavenly Father will forgive you also; 15 But if you do not forgive men their offenses, neither will your Father forgive your offenses.

Luke 11:1 And while He was in a certain place praying, when He ceased, a certain one of His disciples said to Him, Lord, teach us to pray, even as John also taught his disciples. 2 And He said to them, When you pray, say, Father, Your name be sanctified; Your kingdom come. 3 Give us each day our daily bread. 4 And forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us into temptation. 5 And He said to them, Who among you will have a friend and will go to him at midnight and say to him, Friend, lend me three loaves, 6 Since a friend of mine has come to me from a journey and I have nothing to set before him; 7 And that one, from inside, will answer and say, Do not trouble me; the door is already shut and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise up and give you anything? 8 I say to you, Even though he will not rise up and give him anything because he is his friend, surely because of his shameless persistence he will rise and give him what he needs. 9 And I say to you, Ask and it shall be given to you; seek and you shall find; knock and it shall be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it shall be opened.

11 But what father among you whose son shall ask for a fish will instead of a fish hand him a snake? 12 Or if he shall also ask for an egg will hand him a scorpion? 13 If you then being evil know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father who is from heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!

1 Sam 1:10 And she *was* bitter of soul, and prayed to Jehovah, and she wept copiously.

11 And she vowed a vow, and said, O Jehovah of hosts, if You will certainly look upon the affliction of Your handmaid, and shall remember me, and not forget Your handmaid, and shall give to Your maidservant a man-child, then I will give him to Jehovah all the days of his life; and a razor shall not go up on his head. 12 And it happened, when she prayed long before Jehovah, ...

26 And she said, O my lord, may your soul live! My lord, I *am* the woman who stood with you here, to pray to Jehovah. 27 I prayed for this boy, and Jehovah has given my petition which I asked of Him to me. 28 And I also have loaned him to Jehovah; all the days which he shall be, he is loaned to Jehovah. And he worshiped there before Jehovah.

Lk 1:7 And they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and they were both advanced in their days. ...

13 But the angel said to him, Do not be afraid, Zachariah, because your petition has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. ...

18 And Zachariah said to the angel, By what shall I know this? For I am an old man and my wife is advanced in years. 19 And the angel answered and said to him, I am Gabriel, who stands before God, and I was sent to speak to you and to announce the good news of these things to you. 20 And behold, you shall be silent and not able to speak until the day that these things happen, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time.

Mk 6:35 And when the hour had already become late, His disciples came to Him and said, This place is deserted, and the hour is already late; 36 Send them away so that they may go into the surrounding countryside and villages and buy for themselves something to eat. 37 But He answered and said to them, You give them something to eat. And they said to Him, Shall we go away and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give it to them to eat? 38 And He said to them, How many loaves do you have? Go and see. And when they found out, they said, Five, and two fish. ...

8:1 In those days, since there was again a great crowd and they did not have anything to eat, He called the disciples to Him and said to them, 2 I am moved with compassion for the crowd, because for three days now they have remained with Me and they do not have anything to eat. 3 And if I send them away to their home hungry, they will faint on the way; and some of them have come from a distance. 4 And His disciples answered Him, Where will anyone be able to get enough to satisfy these people with bread here in this desolate place? 5 And He asked them, How many loaves do you have? And they said, Seven.

Matt 15:22 And behold, a Canaanite woman came out from those borders and cried out, saying, Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter suffers terribly from demon possession. 23 But He did not answer her a word. And His disciples came and implored Him, saying, Send her away, for she is crying out after us. 24 But He answered and said, I was not sent except to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 25 But she came and worshipped Him, saying, Lord, help me! 26 But He answered and said, It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the little dogs. 27 And she said, Yes, Lord, for even the little dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table. 28 Then Jesus answered and said to her, O woman, great is your faith! Be it done to you as you wish. And her daughter was healed from that hour.

Lk 4:25 But in truth I say to you, There were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the sky was shut up for three years and six months, when a great famine came over all the land; 26 And to none of them was Elijah sent, except to the city of Sarepta of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow. 27 And there were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet, and none of them were cleansed, except Naaman the Syrian.

Luke 21:36 Watch ye therefore and pray always that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass and to stand before the Son of man.

Mt 13:22 And the one sown in the thorns, this is he who hears the word, and the anxiety of the age and the deceitfulness of riches utterly choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful. 23 But the one sown on the good earth, this is he who hears the word and understands, who by all means bears fruit and produces, one a hundredfold, and one sixtyfold, and one thirtyfold.

Lk 8:14 And that which fell into the thorns, these are those who heard and, going away, are utterly choked by anxieties and riches and pleasures of this life, and do not bring any fruit to maturity. 15 But that which is in the good earth, these are those who in a noble and good heart hear the word and hold it fast and bear fruit with endurance.
